Expectations

Here is a list of possible expectations you can use to promote to the teachers, students and parents to help ensure everyone is learning and being respected.

These should be reviewed regularly with everyone involved as a whole so they know what is expected in the Sunday School program. You can add or change things as what works best for your program. Four expectations are reasonable for students. Just remember whatever you decide, you need to communicate that regularly.

A question to ask yourself:

What is needed from our students in order for teachers to teach? Here is an example:

The Way Our Church ACTS

- A ALERT: We are quiet and listen.
- **C CARING:** We are kind to others.
- T THINKING. We are respectful and ready to learn.
- S STIING: We stay seated in our own space.

As you teach this you can expand:

We are alert when we are quiet and listen so be ready so you can hear instructions.

We are caring when we share and help one another.

We are thinking when we raise our hand to ask a question being respectful.

We are sitting so we can make sure everyone has enough space and no distractions.

For Parents Expectations.

- Reinforce our Student Expectations
- Bring children to class regularly and on time
- Help children with any take home memory verses or activities
- Sign up to volunteer for 2 events/tasks a year

This is another example of what parent expectations might look like.

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
