

Lesson 3: How Moses is Similar to Christ

Objectives: Students will...

- 1) Discover why we have prophets in the Bible
- 2) See Jesus prophesized in Deuteronomy
- 3) Understand how Moses is similar to Christ and why that is important for us today

Accommodations: How will I accommodate individual needs of students?

Lesson:

1) Introduction to Lesson

2-5 minutes

As students enter, welcome them and help find a chair to sit at. Thank them for coming. Take attendance (using attendance chart supplied).

Say to students:

This quarter we will continue to study the Old Testament and take a quick look at Deuteronomy - the fifth book in the Old Testament. Deuteronomy means "Second Law" or law repeated. The law was first given at Mount Sinai by Moses to the people in Exodus, now Moses will repeat the law before the Israelites enter into the Promised Land. If you have your Bibles let's find Deuteronomy and turn there now.

2) Deuteronomy 18 - Prophets, Moses and Jesus

10-15 minutes

Optional: Storybook or visuals of this story to show kids (if available)

Last week do you remember what we studied? Moses died after repeating the law to the Israelites - as part of that law we studied Deuteronomy 28 where God gave out the blessing the Israelites would receive if they followed God and the curses or punishment they would receive if they did not obey and

follow God. We also saw how that still applies to us today as Christians; Jesus will bless us if we follow Him!

This week we need to turn to Deuteronomy 18. We will see why we have prophets and we will also see how Moses and Jesus Christ are similar.

Can someone tell me what a prophet is? Let students answer. Idea is a prophet is someone who tells people what God says and they have to be correct and only speak what God allows.

Do you know why we have prophets in the Bible? Let students try and guess

Have students turn to **Deuteronomy 18:15-17** and ask; **Can I get someone to read Deuteronomy 18:15-17?** After reading have them turn to **Deuteronomy 5:22-27** and have them read that aloud, say, **“The Israelites were waiting for God to give them the 10 commandments through Moses on Mount Sinai (also called Mount Horeb), when they heard God’s voice, what did they say? They would die by being consumed by the fire if they heard God’s voice directly anymore, so they asked Moses to go instead.**

What does Deuteronomy 18:15-17 say about why there was going to be prophets from then on?

Because the Israelites did not want to hear God’s voice directly.

Say, **“The Israelites chose to use prophets rather than listen to God’s voice directly. And God honored that, that is why we have prophets in the Bible – because that was what was asked for!”**

Let’s turn back to Deuteronomy 18:15-22 and take turns reading that aloud.

Thank those who volunteered to read and then ask:

According to these verses, what were the qualifications of a prophet? Someone who would speak what God commanded and share it with the people.

How did God say we would know if they were telling the truth or not? Because what they said would happen – would actually happen!

Who did God say He was going to send after Moses? A Prophet like Moses from among the Israelites. And He would speak God’s words.

Who do you think that Prophet is? Jesus!

The Lord promised to raise up a prophet like Moses from among the Israelites. God demanded that the people listen to this Prophet, or He would call them to account. According to the New Testament this prophet was Jesus (See Acts 3:22 and 26).

So why do we have prophets in the Bible? Because the Israelites asked for them instead of listening to God directly for they feared for their lives if they heard God’s voice directly.

Any Questions? Answer those you can, tell students you will find the answer to any question you do not know at this time. And, make sure you get back to them next week.

3) How Moses and Jesus are Similar Chart and Color Page

10-15 minutes

Hand out one Similarity sheet to each student who can read and write along with pencil crayons. Hand out one color page with crayons for younger students who are unable to read and write well.

Tell the students, **“For you younger students you can color the page while the older ones fill in the verses. I still want the younger students to listen very carefully while coloring, ok!?”**



Read the directions and help older students complete the verses. You have the master copy below. The first question asks **Why do we have prophets?** Ask students to answer, if they have trouble have students turn to

Deuteronomy 18:15-17 and read aloud again.

So what do we write down beside the question, “Why God allowed prophets?” Answer: Because the Israelites asked for them rather than hear from God directly!

Ask each student to read one of the similarities from the first line of the chart on their page, example: Both saved in infancy from cruel kings. Go down the entire list. Then have all the older children get their Bibles so they can fill in the blanks of any verse that is missing a word. They must read both Moses and Jesus’ similarities and fill in any words that are missing – answers are below.

After each similarity ask, **“How were Moses and Jesus similar here?”**

Ask students:

Are there any similarities that we too as Christians have with Moses and Jesus? We too should be peacemakers, we are sent by God to proclaim the Word to others, we share the law of God with others, we might face persecution or be rejected by many as we try and share the Word, we should treat others better or higher than ourselves.....

There are a lot of similarities with Moses and Jesus, and we should try to share those similarities where we can aswell!

When done, gather up the crayons, see if students have any questions and then move on to the next activity.

4) Optional: Name that Answer Clue Game

10 minutes

Form two teams – make sure younger and older students are placed together so that the younger ones can receive help from the older students.

Tell the teams that you are going to name a topic. You will then ask Team 1 how many clues they think they need to guess the answer. For example say, “The topic is the book of Genesis. How many clues do you need to guess the answer?” A representative from Team 1 will talk to his or her group and tell you how many clues they need from 1-6. Team 2 then gets a chance to try and answer in fewer clues by making a lower bid. Ask them if they think they can.

Have the teams bid until one of the teams decides it can’t go any lower. That teams will get to try and name the answer!

Read aloud the number of clues underneath the answer without saying what the answer is (See list below) that the lowest team bid. If the team can guess the answer, it scores a point. (Have a sheet of paper to write down each team and how many points they collect). If the answer isn’t right, the other team has a chance to answer and may ask for one more clue.

In the next round, start the bidding with Team 2. Continue until you’ve gone through all your answers. The team that scores the highest wins!

5) Jesus and Prophets Word Search

15 minutes

Hand out one sheet to each child along with pencils. Read the instructions aloud and read the words aloud that they are to find for those who have trouble reading. Help students as needed find the words and while they are searching, ask them;

Why is each word important as it relates to our lesson?

What does the word (pick a word) have to do with what was learned today?



6) Optional - Snack: Strawberries or Mouth Shaped Snack

5 minutes

*Ensure no one has strawberry allergies before handing out snack.

Hand out snack to each child along with a glass of water or juice. Explain that: **Today we learned that what the prophets spoke came from God – they spoke in God’s name. We also learned that Jesus was sent by God and that Jesus Words are true, holy and important for us to have salvation. Let’s remember this as we eat our snack in the shape of a mouth – what we say too is important – let our words be true, holy and pleasing to God!** Provide a napkin for children to clean their hands. Discuss any questions while snacking.

7) Optional - Songs

5 minutes

Have children sing songs with you. Some examples are found in the song section.

8) Close in prayer

*If desired, ask the children if they have any prayer requests and write them down to help you remember. Then ask all children to bow their heads and fold their hands to pray.

Dear God, help us as we study Your perfect Word in the Old Testament to understand it, use it and see the examples of faithful people that followed You. Help us to remember that Your commands are important and need to be followed to live a life that is pleasing to You. Help us all too always love You with our whole heart, mind, strength and soul! Help us this week as we go from our church family – we pray that you will be with us and our families, help us share the good news of Your love to every one we meet and help us to remember to pray and study the Bible every day. We pray that you will bless us for following You. And we pray that you will help us be like Moses – caring, faithful, and obedient to You. Help us to remember that Jesus is the one we follow now and that He was sent to provide us salvation and that all His Words came from You as You prophesied over 3500 years ago through Moses!

Thank you God for Your love, thank you for Your Son Jesus, thank you for caring for us and providing such a beautiful world for us to live in, and thank you for giving us Your Word – the Bible so we can learn what pleases You. In Jesus precious name, Amen.
