<p>What was the good news Joel gave the people? (Allow any of the following: If the people repented, God would make the plants grow. God would save the people. God would bring them back together.)</p>	<p>What is God's good news for you? (Jesus loves me, and will take away my sins when I obey Him!)</p>
<p>What did Joel call the judgment of the Lord? The day of the Lord.</p>	<p>What did the day of the Lord mean in Joel? That God would punish the nation for their sins.</p>
<p>In Joel, did the people repent and turn from their sin? Yes</p>	<p>What other natural disaster happened to the people besides locusts? Fire and/or drought.</p>

Accept any reasonable answer – He is loving, merciful, just, wants people to repent, is caring enough to warn us when we are heading into sin, etc.</p>	<p>What can you learn from the book of Joel? Accept any reasonable answer – we need to pay attention to our sins, we need to listen and turn to God, we need to obey God, etc.</p>
<p>Does God want to save all people? Yes.</p>	<p>What does God promise to give to those who believe and obey? His very own Holy Spirit.</p>

<p>In the book of Micah, where was Jesus to be born? Bethlehem.</p>	<p>What did Micah warn the people? That they were going to captivity because of their sins.</p>
<p>Name the two prophets we studied today? Micah and Joel</p>	<p>Where did Micah preach? In Judah.</p>
<p>What is a prophet? A person who speaks the words of God and what they say comes true.</p>	<p>What is a false prophet? A person who says they speak the words of God but they lie and what they say does not come true.</p>
<p>God says in Micah we need to do justly, what does that mean? To be fair and/or do what is right.</p>	<p>God says in Micah we need to love mercy, what does that mean? We need to be kind hearted, giving, and forgiving one another. (any portion of this answer or something similar will do).</p>
