

# Genesis – God and Families from the Bible Master List of Supplies:

All activity sheets or templates are on website.

## Teacher Materials to be in Classroom every week:

- Pens/Pencils
- Bible (please bring your own)
- Crayons/Pencil Crayons
- Attendance Sheet
- Stickers – enough for each child to have one every lesson for 13 lessons
- Puppet to tell students the real events from the Bible (any puppet or sock decorated as sheep, dog, etc. will do.)

## Additional Supplies for each week

### Week 1:

- Color Follow Along Abram Activity Sheet – one per child
- Ways I Tell God He is Wonderful Activity Sheet – one per child

### Optional Activities

Donkey Craft (Part A this week – you will do the rest next week)

- Donkey Template – two per child cut out before class printed on brown or grey cardstock or heavy construction paper (Two together make one full donkey head)
- Wire Coat Hanger – one per child
- Yarn for mane – one ball of yarn to cut into strips for class to share for donkey mane
- Scissors to share
- Tape and/or glue to share

### Sand Box Abraham Play Time

- Large Flat Plastic Bin with sand poured inside
- Plastic Dolls or Dolls made out of pipe cleaners – enough for children to share
- Little Tents made out of pipe cleaners and paper or cloth – enough to share
- Plastic small animals – sheep, cows, camels, etc. – enough to share
- Soft Ball
- Snack – Animal Crackers
- Napkins
- Cups with water

### Week 2:

- Abram and Lot Separate Color Page – one per child
- Abram's Tent Template Sheet – one per class
- Brown construction or heavy cardstock paper –one per child cut out before class using template as pattern.
- Scissors
- Glue
- Dolls or Play dough for children to make Abram, Sarai and Lot as they pretend to replay the story of Abram and Lot separating and Abram letting Lot choose first.

### Optional Activities

- Storybook of the life of Abram with pictures to show kids (if available) and/or
- Flannel Display Board with the story of life of Abram etc. (if available)
- Animal Teddy Bears or plastic animals to use to show children how the land was too crowded for Abram and Lot's herds.
- Piece of paper for animals to stay on – preferably green to show grass

- Donkey Head Template – made the week before in class – one for each child (If new child comes, quickly make another head but do not put on mane hair so that the donkey is not wet with glue.)
- Wire Coat Hanger – one per child
- Hole Punch – to share
- Foam pool noodle (cut in half) or Dowel rod or old broom handle –approximately 2 feet long each – one per child

You might have to cut the rods with hand saw if using wood

- If using wood handles you will need construction paper sheet – one per child to wrap around wood and wire to hide them.
- Yarn for reins – one long piece of yarn per child
- Scissors to share
- Tape and/or glue to share
- Crayons or markers
- Small paper bag for donkey pack – one per child
- Colored Construction paper for rug – one per child

Sand Box Abraham Play Time

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- Little Tents made out of pipe cleaners and paper or cloth – enough to share
- Plastic small animals – sheep, cows, camels, etc. – enough to share
- Soft Ball
- Snack – Animal Crackers
- Napkins
- Cups with water

### Week 3:

- Glue and/or Tape to share
- Scissors to share
- Father's Day Desk Organizer Template – one per child printed on heavy white construction or cardstock paper
- Grow in the Lord Flower Template – one sheet per child printed on heavy white construction or cardstock paper
- Flower Pot Templates – one sheet per class printed on paper to trace onto craft foam
- Craft Foam – scrap pieces enough for children to share approximately 2 pieces each child 4x 4 inches
- Magnets (if putting flower craft on fridge or tool box)

Optional Activities

- Candies or chocolates to fill Father's day organizer box – enough so each child can put some in their Father's Day box.
- Dolls that represent family – dad, mom, sisters, brothers, baby, etc. and/or books that show children about families and especially mothers.
- "I'm Glad I'm Your Dad" Book (see attached for scanned images) or borrow from library – A Happy Day Book by Bill and Kathy Horlacher
- Snack: Your choice - enough to share
- Napkins
- Cups with water

#### Week 4:

- Scissors for teacher or assistant to cut out stars and shields before class
- Find the Stars Color Activity Page – one per child
- Stars in the Sky Activity Sheet – one per child
- Stars Template – one sheet per child cut out before class on yellow card or construction paper or if possible cut out one star as template and then trace onto craft foam to make multiple stars for children to do activities with – at least 3 stars per child
- Basket or box (about the size of a laundry hamper)

#### Optional Activities

- Storybook of the life of Abram with pictures to show kids (if available) and/or
- Flannel Display Board with the story of life of Abram etc. (if available)
- God Is Our Shield Decoration Page – printed and cut out onto white paper – one per child (There are two shields on each page)
- Stickers to decorate shields – enough to share
- Count the Stars Dot to Dot Activity Page – one per child
- Finger Puppet Template(s) – cut out puppets before class – one set for teacher to wear and if desired one set per child
- Dolls or Play dough for children to make Abram, Sarai and Lot as they pretend to replay the story of Abram and Lot separating and Abram letting Lot choose first.
- Soft Ball
- Dolls, especially baby boy and man doll; foam stars (can use ones from activity above); Paper or toy shields – enough to put in basket or box to play “Feel it” Game
- Snack: Star Shaped Cheese and/or Bread, Cookies                      2 per child
- Napkins
- Cups with water

#### Week 5:

- Abraham and the Three Visitors Color Page – one per student
- Be Kind Goodie Bag Sticker Template – one set per child – 2 sets on a page
- Paper Lunch Bag – one per child
- Glue sticks or Tape – to share
- Scissors – to cut out template
- Goodies to put into bag as a gift ex: pencil, small paper pad, candies, chocolates, etc. \*If cost is a factor, provide a piece of paper for each child to write a nice message and insert into the paper bag as the “gift”.
- Ways to Show Kindness like Abraham Activity Sheet

#### Optional Activities

- Storybook of the life of Abram with pictures to show kids (if available) and/or
- Flannel Display Board or Visual Aids with the story of life of Abram etc. (if available)
- Real tent or blanket to use as tent
- Dolls or Play dough for children to make Abraham, Sarai and the three visitors to pretend different ways that Abraham was kind.
- Soft Ball
- Snack – 2 Graham Crackers and 4 Mini Marshmallows per child
- Napkins
- Cups with water

#### Week 6:

- Color by Number – Abraham’s Family Color Sheet – one per child
- Mother’s Care for Us Activity Sheet – one per child
- Sarah has a Baby Boy Color and Sticker Sheet – one per child
- Glue sticks to share
- Scissors for teacher to help cut out baby sticker – to share

#### Optional Activities

- Storybook of the life of Abraham with pictures to show kids (if available) and/or
- Flannel Display Board or Visual Aids with the story of life of Abraham etc. (if available)
- Real tent or blanket to use as tent
- Isaac is Born Blanket Template – printed on blue construction paper – one per child
- Paper fastener or Brad – one per child to fasten blanket
- Yarn – small piece – one per child
- Scissors – to share
- Facial Tissues or Paper Towel cut in square – 2 pieces each child
- Fine Tip Marker or Pen – one to share to draw facial features of baby Isaac
- Dolls or Play dough for children to make Abraham, Sarai and family
- Baby Dolls for children to play with and rock
- Snack – 2 Graham Crackers and 4 Mini Marshmallows per child
- Napkins
- Cups with water

#### Week 7:

- Activity Game Template – print one per class onto cardstock paper and cut shapes before class
- Tape to hold down pictures or if doing activity outside you can use sidewalk chalk, tape for fans to assemble and tape for camel activity.
- Abraham Sends His Servant to Rebekah Fans – print one set per child
- Popsicle sticks –one for each fan – three per child
- Camel Sheet – print one per student and cut out
- Scissors for teacher to cut out camel – to share
- Black Marker for teacher to draw camel face – one for teacher
- Rebekah is Kind Color Page – one per child

#### Optional Activities

- Storybook of the life of Abraham with pictures to show kids (if available) and/or
- Flannel Display Board or Visual Aids with the story of life of Abraham etc. (if available)
- Rebekah Was Kind Water Pitcher Activity Template - 2 Pitchers per Page – printed on paper – one pitcher per child cut out before class
- Dolls or Play Dough to share – children can retell the event of Eliezer finding Rebekah using dolls or play dough
- Snack – Cheese or Fruit cut into star shapes – enough for each child
- Napkins
- Cups with water

#### Week 8:

- Jacob and Esau Color Page – one per child
- Tent Template – one for class
- Sheet of Cardboard – one per child to trace tent template onto – cut out before class
- Construction paper – enough to trace tent border – one per child cut out before class
- Scrap ribbons, construction paper, stickers – enough to share and decorate tents
- Scissors to share

- Glue or tape to share

#### Optional Activities

- Storybook of this event with pictures to show kids (if available) and/or
- Flannel Display Board or Visual Aids of story (if available)
- Real tent or blanket to use as tent
- Jacob and Esau – Create Page – one page per child
- Red yarn or string cut into small pieces for Esau’s hair
- Brown or yellow string or yarn for Jacob’s hair
- Googly eyes – 4 eyes per child – 2 for Jacob and 2 for Esau (or you can draw eyes instead.)
- Gluesticks to share
- Dolls or Play dough for children to make Abraham, Sarai and family
- Baby Dolls for children to play with and rock
- Snack – Lentil Stew – see recipe below along with Styrofoam cups and spoons for each child (or if unable – a piece of bread for each child to show that Jacob gave bread and stew.)
- Napkins
- Cups with water

#### Week 9:

- Activity Game Template – print one per class onto cardstock paper and cut shapes before class
- Tape to hold down pictures or if doing activity outside you can use sidewalk chalk
- Large Stone to show class and take turns pretending to sleep on – one per class
- Jacob’s Journey T.V. Show Page – one per child – cut out before class
- Scissors to Share
- Tape or Stapler and staples to share
- Paper Cupcake Wrappers – preferably yellow – one per child
- Foil Cupcake Wrappers – one per child - preferably silver or white (if you can’t find foil wrappers – plain white ones will do)
- Scrap paper – to make a one inch circle for each child for Angel’s head – cut before class
- Markers or felt tip pen to share – to draw Angel’s face
- String – one 8 inch piece per child

#### Optional Activities

- Storybook of Bible story with pictures to show kids (if available) and/or
- Flannel Display Board or Visual Aids etc. (if available)
- Blanket or sleeping bag to use while children pretend to be Jacob and have a dream (use along with large stone above)
- Jacob’s Dream Color Page – one per child
- Hop on the Stones Memory Verse Game Template – one per class printed on cardstock paper cut out before class

#### Sand Box Jacob Play Time

- Large Flat Plastic Bin with sand poured inside
- Plastic Dolls or Dolls made out of pipe cleaners – enough for children to share
- Small pebbles to act as stones for “Jacob the doll” to sleep on
- Snack – Pretzel Sticks – enough for each child to have 8
- Napkins
- Cups with water

### Week 10:

- Jacob is a Shepherd Color Page – one per child
- Sheep Face Template – one per child printed on white construction or cardstock paper cut out before class
- String to tie the mask together – enough for each child
- Cotton balls – enough for each child to cover the head of their sheep mask – approximately 6 each if torn and fluffed
- Hole punch to share
- Glue sticks to share
- Scissors for teacher to help cut out sheep face template – to share

#### Optional Activities

- Storybook of the Bible story with pictures to show kids (if available) and/or
- Flannel Display Board or Visual Aids. (if available)
- Cotton balls – enough for each child to have some to glue onto color page sheep
- Glue sticks to share
- Grass clippings – enough for each child to glue or tape some grass onto color page
- Stickers of livestock animals to add to color page
- Mirror for children to look in
- Dolls and Animals – enough to share OR
- Play dough – enough to share

#### Sand Box Jacob Play Time

- Large Flat Plastic Bin with sand poured inside
- Plastic Dolls or Dolls made out of pipe cleaners – enough for children to share
- Little Tents made out of pipe cleaners and paper or cloth – enough to share
- Plastic small animals – sheep, cows, camels, etc. – enough to share
- Snack – Animal crackers - 6 per child
- Napkins
- Cups with water
- Puppet to tell students the real events from the Bible

### Week 11:

- Design Joseph's Coat Color Page – one per child
- Joseph's Special Coat Matching Page – one per child
- Pipe Cleaners in 5 Different Colors – 5 per child cut into 8 inch strips, keep extra pieces
- 1 inch wooden bead with ½ inch opening or use 1 inch foam ball – one per child
- Black and Green Yarn – enough to share
- Scissors to share
- Glue to share
- Markers – Black and Red to draw face – enough to share

#### Optional Activities

- Storybook of the Bible story with pictures to show kids (if available) and/or
- Flannel Display Board or Visual Aids. (if available)
- Joseph Color Page – one per child
- Grocery Sized Paper Bag - one per child
- Scissors to share
- Glue to share
- Scrap ribbon, stickers, buttons, yarn, sequins and/or construction paper pieces – enough for all children to use to decorate the paper bag.
- Snack – Cookies with Many Different Sprinkles and Colors one per child
- Napkins/Cups with Water

### Week 12:

- Activity Game Template – print one per class onto cardstock paper and cut shapes before class
- Tape to hold down pictures or if doing activity outside you can use sidewalk chalk
- Joseph's Dream Color Page – one per child
- White Sheet of Paper – one per child

#### Optional Activities

- Storybook of the Bible story with pictures to show kids (if available) and/or
- Flannel Display Board with pictures or Visual Aids. (if available)
- Pictures of or gather some real grain/wheat on stalks to show students
- Pictures of stars, moon, and sun to show students
- Paper plate or black foam sheet or construction paper – one for class to share
- Non-toxic washable black paint– enough for you to paint \*if using paper plate
- Something to cut holes and shapes – hole punch or star shaped punch outs or exacto knife
- Flashlight
- Paintbrush \*if using paper plate and needing to paint it black
- Star stickers to share
- Pieces of grain or grain leaves or seeds to share
- Glue to glue grain pieces to color page
- Dolls and Animals – enough to share OR
- Play dough – enough to share
- Large Flat Plastic Bin with sand poured inside
- Plastic Dolls or Dolls made out of pipe cleaners – enough for children to share  
(if made Joseph pipe cleaner last week you can use him as well)
- Little Tents made out of pipe cleaners and paper or cloth – enough to share
- Plastic small animals – sheep, cows, camels, etc. – enough to share
- Snack – Star shaped Cheese, Apples, or Bread – enough for each child
- Napkins
- Cups with water

### Week 13:

- God Provides Color and Activity Page – one per child
- God Will Provide Chick Template Page – printed on white construction or cardstock paper – one per child
- Seeds – small seeds to glue onto chick page
- White glue or glue sticks to share
- Scissors to share
- Brad or paper fastener clip – one per child
- God Provides for Joseph's Family Color Page – one per child

#### Optional Activities

- Storybook of the Bible story with pictures to show kids (if available) and/or
- Flannel Display Board with pictures or Visual Aids. (if available)
- Soft Ball – to share
- Dolls and Animals – enough to share OR
- Play dough – enough to share
- Large Flat Plastic Bin with sand poured inside
- Plastic Dolls or Dolls made out of pipe cleaners – enough for children to share
- Little Tents made out of pipe cleaners and paper or cloth – enough to share
